^{**}In addition to the applicable fees and expenses, a commission of <u>six percent</u> on all money received and disbursed by the sheriff on execution or order of sale, order of attachment, decree or on sale of real property or personal property. However, in no case may the commission be <u>less than fifty dollars</u> or <u>more than three thousand five</u>

hundred dollars. If the execution or order of sale is a foreclosure of a real estate mortgage, the commission may not be more than one thousand five hundred dollars. The commissions shall be included as part of the cost of execution, order of sale, order of attachment, decree, or on sale of real personal property, which shall be paid by the debtor out of the proceeds. However in each case of redemption prior to the sale, the sheriff is entitled to the commission as stated above, to be paid by the redemptioner as a cost of redemption.

For a case in the circuit court, if a person, in whose favor an execution or order of sale is issued, bids on the property sold on execution or decree, the sheriff or officer making the sale shall receive the following compensation: if the amount for which the property is bid on is one thousand dollars or less, the sum of **forty dollars: and if the amount for which the property is bid on is more than one thousand dollars, the sum of **one hundred dollars**.
